PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2007 has seen a year of consolidation for Ausglass with the adoption of the new Constitution at the AGM in March and the finalisation of the Code of Conduct for Directors. It was resolved by the Board that it should be a requirement that new directors who sign the Consent to Act Form should also sign that they have read, understood and agree to abide by the Code. Both the Constitution and the Code of Conduct can be found on the website by following the Corporate Information link on the sidebar. I would particularly like to acknowledge and thank Minter Ellison Lawyers for their assistance in preparing both of these documents. 2007 also saw the organisation being granted Deductible Gift Recipient Status (DGR) and TCC status with the Australian Taxation Office.

Our main focus has been the planning and preparation for the 2008 Conference in Canberra, 'Open House'. As everyone is aware, planning a conference by a group of volunteers is an enormous task and I am deeply grateful to the Conference committee comprising Richard Whiteley, Kirstie Rea and Charles Higgins together with Mel Douglas who has made an enormous contribution. I would also like to thank all the Canberra glass community for their work in bringing the conference together. I must also give my appreciation to the Canberra Glassworks and the School of Art at the ANU who will host the conference and have been significantly supportive in the planning and preparation.

The Board is pleased to announce that planning is underway for a 2009 Conference in Tasmania. It was decided to have a conference one year after the Canberra Conference to bring us back into line with our previous two-yearly conference program as there was a gap of three years between the GAS Adelaide Conference and the Canberra conference. Ausglass celebrates its 30th Anniversary in December, 2008 and this Conference will celebrate this anniversary. A conference committee has been formed and planning is underway.

I would like to thank the Ausglass Board for their commitment and work for the organisation, each having taken up the numerous roles and offering perspectives which balance the running of the organisation. Ruth McCallum Howell has forwarded her resignation effective from December 31, 2007. Ruth has been on the Board since 2005, undertaking the position of secretary, and both I and the Board extend our thanks to her for her contribution and effort and best wishes for her future. We also welcomed Michelle Kaucic in October of this year. Michelle was co-opted onto the Board and has proven a valuable addition.

It has been a difficult year for Simon James, our newsletter Editor, who entered hospital in late July and remained there until late November. He has been keeping in touch with the Board and undertook our latest newsletter and I would particularly like to thank him for editing the Newsletter every four months and wish him well with his health in the future.

Congratulations went to Nicole Ayliffe who was the winner of the inaugural Ausglass Vicki Torr Online Gallery prize. The second Ausglass Vicki Torr Online Gallery prize is currently underway and the winner will be announced at the Conference in Canberra in January, 2008. There has been a significant increase in the number of exhibitors in the Online Gallery such that we now have nearly 70 exhibitors and the random image from the Online Gallery appearing on the homepage every time the site is visited has increased the profile of the exhibitors. I encourage all members to take advantage of the opportunity to exhibit through the Ausglass Online Gallery.

I would like to particularly thank Arthur Sale for his continuing work with the Website. Arthur's vigilance and guidance together with his computer expertise have enabled the website to grow and be maintained at a high standard.

I am also extremely grateful to Julien Stannus who assists with website matters and undertakes the maintenance of the Ausglass Online Gallery.

I would also like to thank and acknowledge the State Representatives and Pauline North, State Representative Liaison Officer, all of whom endeavour to coordinate information and bring this to the Board and members. I also thank them for their contributions to the Newsletter. This year we welcomed Brenda Page and Kristin McFarlane as State Representatives for Victoria, Gayle Shaw for Qld and Wendy Fairclough, Jennifer Taylor and Kristel Britcher for SA.

I am also grateful to Anne Yule from Minter Ellison Lawyers, our Minute Secretary. This is a most important position and we are most appreciative that she continues to do this.

Sadly this year saw the passing away of Anne Dybka, an Honorary Life Member of Ausglass. Anne had been a highly respected, long-standing contributor to the glass community in Australia and will be sadly missed.

We once again find ourselves in a strong financial position with consolidation of the basic functions of the organisation and in a strong position for growth. We look forward to receiving ideas from our membership and people interested in contemporary glass in Australia for the future.

I look forward to seeing everyone in Canberra at the Conference and the AGM in January.

TREASURER'S REPORT

For the year ended 31 October 2007 Ausglass generated a surplus of \$21,138 before transfer of investment income to the Vicki Torr Reserve (VTR) of \$5,195. This continues the improvement achieved during the previous 30 months. The results for the current year can be compared to recent prior period results as follows:

Ausglass has continued to improve its financial position during the current financial year albeit in comparison to the 2006 year it is a significantly reduced net surplus of \$15,918 after the transfer to of investment income to the Vicki Torr Reserve.

The fact that Ausglass has generated a surplus in a non-conference year for the second year running is an achievement and the Board of Directors in place during this year must be commended for this. The key factors contributing to the surplus for the current year were:

- Membership income has remained steady for the past two years at a little over \$24,000 in both years;
- That total expenditure of approximately \$12,000 was able to be kept below 2006 total expenditure of about the same amount. This means that the surplus generated from members revenue less operating cost was about \$12,000;
- The balance of the net surplus for the current year was from investment income attributable to Ausglass of approximately \$4,000, an increase of about \$1,600 on the previous year.

The aim now is to run the Open House Conference in Canberra so that it is at least revenue neutral, to keep other costs under control and to further build Ausglass' financial resources so as to enable Ausglass to further improve its services to members.

In the current year the cash reserves of Ausglass have been increased to \$108,700 and the Vicki Torr Fund balance now stands at \$91,000. Given that having financial strength is a key to determining what Ausglass can do for its members, it is important that Ausglass' financial base, as at 31 October 2007, be preserved and increased whenever possible. To this end the policy of the Board of Ausglass continues to be that the association should, at least, break even in non-conference years and that it should make a surplus in conference years. The challenge will be to ensure that this happens during the 2008 financial year.

The other major achievements during the current year included:

- On 14 September 2007 the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) issued a notice to Ausglass endorsing it for Charity Tax Concessions (CTC); and
- On 12 October 2007 the ATO issued a notice to Ausglass endorsing it as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

The CTC endorsement is just an official confirmation of the status that Ausglass has always assumed it had. The DGR endorsement means that Ausglass has now been placed on the Australian Register of Cultural Organisations. Both endorsements are significant in that the majority of philanthropic organisations, government bodies and educational institutions now insist on proof of CTC and DGR status before they will

provide financial assistance or provide concessionary access to their facilities. In the case of the Open House Conference one grant application was about to be automatically rejected until we were able to provide copies of the certificates issued by the ATO. Once these were provided the grant application was able to be submitted for consideration and it was subsequently approved.

Obtaining DGR certification has two potential financial benefits for Ausglass:

- It enables funding and assistance to be obtained from a wider range of funding bodies; and
- It enables tax deduction certificates to be issued to people or organisations making donations to Ausglass.

DGR does not come without its cost as there will be ongoing ATO reporting requirements and there are accounting requirements that require specific treatment of funds received for which Ausglass has issued a tax deduction certificate but, provided that we adhere to these rules, there appears to be scope for Ausglass to obtain better funding for projects that comply with Ausglass' Objectives, as set out in our constitution, and which are in compliance with the Governments intentions in issuing DGR certificates.

That's it for this year. Ausglass has made further important steps forward during the current year resulting in it further strengthening its financial position and the Board is determined, with the help of members, to maintain this position.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT AUSGLASS

Ausglass' goals and objectives:

Our vision is to be recognised as the foremost body for the promotion of contemporary glass in Australia. We seek to achieve this by fostering effective communication between our members and interested parties.

Our Organisation's structure:

Ausglass (The Australian Association of Glass Artists) Limited is a public company limited by guarantee, which operates pursuant to its Constitution, Articles of Association and the Corporations Act 2001. Every member undertakes to contribute an amount to the company in the event that it is wound up and does not have sufficient funds to meet its debts and obligations. This guarantee is limited to \$10, and applies in the event that the company is wound up whilst he/she is a member or within one year of their membership ceasing. The company operates on a non-profit basis. This means that any profits, income or property of the company cannot be paid or distributed directly or indirectly to its members.

Volunteers Run Ausglass:

The company has a Board of volunteer directors who are elected by voting members, although the directors may appoint or co-opt other directors to the Board to fill vacancies that may occur. Elected directors are appointed for a three-year term. Co-opted directors serve until the next election but may offer themselves up for re-election. To ensure that new directors are brought onto the Board, at least three directors step down each year whilst the others remain to maintain the Board's experience and stability. The board meets at a face to face meeting, at least once a year, and monthly by teleconference during the rest of the year.

The Board of Directors is responsible for running Ausglass and appoints office bearers from its ranks.

Local contact with members is maintained through volunteer State and Territory Representatives who are appointed by voting members for a period of two years. State and Territory Representatives are charged with the responsibility of implementing state/territory initiatives including activities such as member's meetings, workshops, exhibitions, etc.

The organisation does not employ any staff. It may from time to time, however, contract with consultants for various services.

AUSGLASS ACTIVITIES FOR 2006-07

Significant Ausglass events and activities that occurred during the year ended 31 October 2006 included:

- The extensive work of the Canberra Open House Conference Committee in their ongoing effort to hold a successful conference in January 2008;
- The awarding of the first Vicki Torr Online Gallery Prize to Nicole Ayliffe;
- The running of the second Vicki Torr Online Gallery Prize for emerging artists with the prize to be awarded at the Open House Conference:
- The ongoing quarterly publication of the newsletter in electronic format despite the serious illness of its editor. Simon James:
- The completion of another successful financial year making it three years in succession;
- The adoption of a Code of Conduct for Directors and Senior Executives with the considerable assistance of Minter Ellison Lawyers;
- The endorsement of Ausglass as a Deductible Gift Recipient by the Australian Government with considerable assistance of Minter Ellison Lawyers;
- The endorsement of the Association for Charity Tax Concessions by the Australian Taxation Office; and
- The ongoing upgrade of www.ausglass.org.au.

THE VICKI TORR MEMORIAL FUND

The Vicki Torr Memorial Fund was first established in 1993 as a memorial to Australian glass artist, Vicki Torr (1949-1992). Its purpose is to reflect the philosophies of Vicki's life and work, and to this end its stated aim is to encourage excellence in Australian studio glass through the awarding of the Vicki Torr Memorial Prize. Past recipients of the prize have been: Kirstie Rae 1999, Scott Chaseling 2001, Simon Butler 2003 and the 2005 joint recipients, Cobi Cockburn and Daniela Turrin.

During 2006 The Ausglass Directors in conjunction with the Executive Officer for the Fund, Declan Somerville, instituted a new prize, The Vicki Torr Online Gallery Prize for emerging glass artists who exhibit in the Ausglass Online Gallery. It is hoped that this prize will develop into a significant prize for emerging glass artists and will help the Ausglass Online Gallery become a significant space for promoting contemporary glass practitioners. The first winner of The Vicki Torr Online Gallery Prize was Nicole Ayliffe.

HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

The Ausglass Honorary Life Membership Award was first instituted in 1999. It is awarded in recognition of an outstanding contribution to this organisation and/or, more generally, the field of contemporary studio glass.

The recipient is selected by the Ausglass Board on the recommendation of its Honorary Life Membership Sub-Committee. The Committee makes its recommendations based on nominations received from members through a formal nomination process. Where an award is given it is announced at each biennial conference. The current Honorary Life Members are Maureen Cahill and Judith Le Lievre. Sadly our third Honorary Life Member, Anne Dybka, passed away during the year.

THE AUSGLASS NEWSLETTER

Ausglass produces a quarterly electronic newsletter for its members and this is the major vehicle for the organisation to communicate with its members. Contributions to, and the editing of, the newsletter is provided totally by volunteers but support from members is still needed. THE AUSGLASS WEBSITE AND MEMBERS@ E-MAIL GROUP

The Ausglass Website has become an important vehicle for Ausglass to communicate with its members and the general public and to assist Ausglass in meeting its objectives. The Website currently incorporates:

- A brief history of Ausglass and a copy of its constitution;
- A copy of the Code of Conduct for Directors;
- · Copies of recent newsletters and recent annual reports;
- The Ausglass Online Gallery;
- The members@ausglass.org.au communication system:
- The Ausglass Forum, a discussion group open to anyone interested in contemporary glass;
- Details of recent and upcoming conferences; and
- Membership information, membership update forms and membership application forms.

The Ausglass Online Gallery is open to all contemporary glass artists (other than affiliated members) who pay the appropriate annual subscription fee. Details of how to exhibit in the gallery are to be found at www.ausglass.org.au. Since the establishment of the Vicki Torr Online Gallery Prize the number of exhibitors in the gallery is nearing 70 and continues to grow.

Through the generous efforts of Arthur Sale the Website continues to improve and provide better information and services to members.

Ausglass has an e-mail group, members@ausglass.org.au, which enables all members who have provided their e-mail address to the membership secretary to communicate with other Ausglass members provided that they follow the instructions contained on the Ausglass Website.

STATE AND TERRITORY ACTIVITIES

The State and Territory representatives have been charged by the Board with the task of identifying and coordinating member activities on a state by state basis. As part of this mandate, State and Territory Representatives endeavour to ensure that at least four state meetings take place each year. All State members are invited to attend. These meetings provide a forum for discussion of organisation or industry specific issues, and are usually accompanied by presentations on current topics by a member or industry professional.

In order to ensure that issues discussed and raised by members at state level are effectively communicated to the national body, the board has accepted Pauline North's offer to continue as the State/Territory Representative Liaison Officer. This allows an efficient channel of communication between the states/territories, and provides the Board with feedback and specific state input to national directives.

Apart from general meetings, State and Territory representatives are also encouraged to discuss other initiatives with the membership. Initiatives such as the Western Australian based Flair exhibition will continue, but initiatives can only continue with the support of the membership.

THE AUSGLASS CONFERENCE


The Ausglass Conference is usually held biennially however when in 2004 a call for interest in hosting the next Ausglass conference was directed to State and Territory Representatives, Canberra ACT was selected




To bring the organisation back into line with our previous two-yearly conference program, the next conference will be held in Tasmania in January, 2009. A conference committee has been formed and planning is underway.

AUSGLASS WEBSITE TRAFFIC

Ausglass, with significant input and site development by Arthur Sale, continues to progressively upgrade our homepage. The graphs below provide a recent history of traffic on the Ausglass Website.







The reduction in traffic in September reflects a period when the Ausglass site was closed down due to a persistent SPAM attack and also due to our Internet Service Provider upgrading their servers and causing accessibility problems for a time. The overall increase in traffic over the four months ended 31 October 2007 is indicative of the increased awareness of the Ausglass site and, in particular, is a result of:

- The increasing number of members who are exhibiting in the Online Gallery;
- The traffic being generated by the Open House Conference; and
- The increased awareness of the site brought about by the members@ausglass.org.au communication system.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

Your directors present their report on the company for the year ended 31 October 2007.

The surplus for the year after providing for income tax amounted to \$21,138 (2006 - \$26,976 surplus). This surplus is before the allocation of a net \$4,194 to the Vicki Torr Memorial Fund (2006 - \$3,439).

A review of the operations of the company during the year ended 31 October 2007 and the results of those operations found that Ausglass did not hold its biennial conference during the current reporting period as the next Conference is not due until early 2008 in Canberra. During the current year the Board concentrated on improving communications with members, increasing the relevance and usefulness of the Ausglass website, implementing a new Constitution and further strengthening Ausglass' financial position.

On 14th September 2007 the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) issued a certificate endorsing Ausglass for Tax Charity Concessions. This endorsement does not alter the status that Ausglass has enjoyed since its inception but does make Ausglass' status formal and this should assist Ausglass when applying to funding bodies for funding. On 12 October 2007 the Australian Federal Government endorsed Ausglass as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) and entered Ausglass on the Register of Cultural Organisations. A certificate formalising Ausglass' DGR status was issued by the ATO on 9 November 2007. DGR status should also assist Ausglass when approaching philanthropic organisations for funding.

No other significant changes in the entity's state of affairs occurred during the financial year.

The principal activity of the company during the financial year was to contribute to the advancement of contemporary glass in Australia. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which have significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the company in future financial years.

Likely developments in the operations of the company and the expected results of those operations in future financial years have not been included in this report as the inclusion of such information is likely to result in unreasonable prejudice to the company.

The company's operations are not regulated by any significant environment regulation under a law of the Commonwealth or of a State or Territory.

Ausglass' constitution precludes the payment of dividends and no dividends have been paid or declared since the start of the financial year.

Ausglass, as a membership based organisation has no share capital and, as such, no options to shares in the company have been granted during the financial year and there were no options outstanding at the end of the financial year.

During or since the end of the financial year the company has given an indemnity or entered an agreement to indemnify, or paid or agreed to pay insurance premiums as follows:

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2007

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial report covers Ausglass (The Australian Association of Glass Artists) Ltd as an individual entity. Ausglass (The Australian Association of Glass Artists) Ltd is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Company

The company was incorporated to takeover and to continue the activities of The Australian Association of Glass Artists Inc.

(b) Income Tax

The Company is an exempt association for income tax purposes pursuant to Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. On 14th September 2007 the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) issued a certificate endorsing Ausglass for Tax Charity Concessions. This endorsement does not alter the status that Ausglass has enjoyed since its inception. On 12 October 2007 the Australian Federal Government endorsed Ausglass as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) and entered Ausglass on the Register of Cultural Organisations. A certificate formalising Ausglass' DGR status was issued by the ATO on 9 November 2007.

(c) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within twelve months and net of bank overdrafts.

(d) Revenue

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the members. Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets. All revenue is stated net of the amount of the goods and services tax (GST). Membership fees relating to future financial years are now shown as income received in advance and included in the balance sheet.

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(f) Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards

Ausglass (The Australian Association of Glass Artists) Ltd has prepared financial statements in accordance with AIFRS from 1 October 2005. The accounting policies set out above have been consistently applied to all years presented.
